Happy Holidays! The month of December will be a busy one. We will be singing holiday songs, learning finger plays, decorating our classroom, hearing many Christmas stories, and exploring holiday celebrations that are different from ours. Anyone with clearances who would like to spend a morning or part of a morning with us is welcome. We will be very busy with our Christmas preparations and welcome the extra help. As you will notice in our list of events, there are specific days we will need help as well.

Our concepts will include the review of shapes and numeral recognition. We will be talking about the letters and their sounds. As we continue to learn our letters and numerals, please reinforce letters and numerals whenever you can. Most children can *recite* the letters in their names but are unable to recognize them out of order or in isolation. Bathtub foam and bathtub crayons are perfect Christmas ideas that can be used to practice letters and numerals while playing in the tub!

We continue to include social and emotional development activities throughout the week. We have been encouraging the children to interact with new friends and have been doing partner activities to help them in getting to know their classmates.
